Claims By Opponents of Proposition K are Opinions Not Facts

Today the opponents of Proposition K conceded that their key arguments are mere opinion and not verifiable facts. This concession was a result of a complaint filed against them charging that their paid ballot arguments contained numerous "false and misleading" statements.

"The opponents of Proposition K have based their campaign on deceptive scare tactics alleging that investigations and prosecution of human trafficking would be negatively affected by Proposition K's passage. Nothing could be further from the truth and we ask the opponents of Proposition K to stop this deplorable strategy." said Yes On Proposition K spokesperson Maxine Doogan.

"These kinds of scare tactics are similar to one's used by anti-gay rights crusader Anita Bryant in the 1970's to oppose the decriminalization of sodomy laws which were used to oppress homosexuals', said Attorney and civil rights activists Phil Horne.

"Proposition K will improve worker and public safety by decriminalizing sex-for-hire work, this Proposition is fundamentally about extending basic human rights to all members of society regardless of their occupational status. It in no way prevents the enforcement of laws against human trafficking, in fact Prop K says the opposite. This ruling should serve as a warning to the voters of San Francisco of the dishonest practices of the No on K campaign." added Doogan
